Zenia J. Davis, a witness of lawful age produced on the Plaintiff, being duly sworn and examined viva voce, deposes as follows: -

My name is Zenia J. Davis (formerly Getzendanner), having been married to George R. Davis on June 16th 1902; I am a daughter of Georgette M. F. Getzendanner and Solomon J. Getzendanner, and Bertha Van Horn, married to John Van Horn, Cora Minnick, married to Jacob D. Minnick, Katie R. Geisinger, married to George D. Geisinger, are my sisters, and we four are the only heirs at law of the said Georgette.

Our mother, the said Georgette Getzendanner, died on the 16th of April, 1894, seized and possessed of the property described in Exhibit No. 1 filed herewith, which correctly describes said property. My father died on May 31st 1902, and both of them died intestate. The property is a dwelling house and is incapable of division among the parties in interest and can not be divided among them without great loss and injury. All the defendants reside in Frederick County and are adults, and my sister, Katie R. Geisinger has been adjudged a lunatic by the Circuit Court for Frederick County as will appear by a copy of said adjudication herewith filed as Exhibit No. 2, and she is still in Montevieu Hospital in Frederick County. My husband and my self are also adults and reside in Frederick County.
