

Wilson died intestate in March 1930 and my brother Harry, her husband, died in October 1933. At the time of the decease of my sister-in-law Olivia, she held title to two pieces of property in Woodville District, Frederick County, Maryland, the first tract contained  $27\frac{1}{4}$  acres and 12 square perches of land and then she had another little parcel of land along side of that containing 10 acres of land. She obtained title to this land by two deeds both of which are dated the 25th day of May 1925 and both of which were filed for record on June 6, 1925 and certified copies of the said deeds are filed in this case and marked respectively Exhibits 1 and 2. They were handed me and I now look at them and they correctly describe the property. Olivia Wilson and Harry E. Wilson her husband at the time of their respective deceases left surviving them as their heirs at law the following children, a daughter Rachel now about 20 years of age whose husband's name is LeRoy Harrison, an infant son Edwin B. now about 18 years of age, and infant son Robert E. now about 15 years of age, an infant daughter Hallie now about 11 years of age, an infant daughter Marie now about 9 years of age and an infant son Albert now about 7 years of age, all of whom are residents of Frederick County, Maryland and are defendants in this case. Neither my brother Harry nor his wife Olivia left a will and each of them died intestate. They nor neither one of them left any personal property sufficient to pay the debts or the costs of the administration. At the time of the death of both of them they were indebted to my brother John Evan Wilson in the sum of \$700.00 upon their joint and several single bill dated the 1st day of September 1925 payable to the said John Evan Wilson or order, six months after date for \$700.00 for value received with interest from date and there was paid upon said promissory note on the 1st day of March 1926 the sum of \$21.00 as interest thereon as credited on the back of the note filed in this case and marked Exhibit No. 4. The said Olivia and Harry Wilson, her husband, were in their respective lifetime and at the time of their decease indebted to myself in the sum of \$700.00 upon their joint and several single bill dated September 1, 1925 and payable to my order six months after date for the said sum of \$700.00 for value received with interest from date and there was paid on said note and interest the sum of \$147.00 which has been credited on the back of the said single bill and I am filing said single bill in this case marked Exhibit No. 3. This land is situated in Frederick County, Maryland in Woodville District, it is improved with a frame dwelling house, with nine rooms, and the necessary out buildings and there is also on this property a store room in which has been conducted for many years a small country store. I should say that the improvements on this property is in a fair state of repair and that the land and buildings in my opinion would sell for \$1500.00.

DANIEL D. WILSON, a witness of lawful age produced on the part of the plaintiff, being first duly sworn viva voce, deposes and says:

My name is Daniel D. Wilson, I am 37 years of age and reside in Woodville District, Frederick County, Maryland. I know all the parties to this cause and the land mentioned in these proceedings. Olivia Wilson was the wife of my brother Harry and my sister in law, and of course knew her and the family. She died in 1930 intestate seized and possessed of two small tracts of land in Woodville District this County, Exhibits Nos. 1 and 2 filed with the bill of complaint in this cause are certified copies of the deeds to that land, I now look at them and they correctly describe them. Harry died in October 1933 intestate. They left surviving them the following children as their heirs at
