

The report of sale of C. Robert Brillhart, Collector of State and County taxes for Carroll County, Maryland, respectfully shows:

1. 4 That he was the Collector of state and County taxes for Carroll County, in the State of Maryland, for the years 1930, 1931, 1932, 1933 and 1934, duly appointed by the County Commissioners of Carroll County.

2. That prior to the giving of the notice hereinafter mentioned, there was due and owing by Florence E. Stitely, of said County and State, the owner of the land hereinafter mentioned, the following sums of money to the said Collector, for State and County taxes to wit:

3. That the real estate assessed to the said Florence E. Stitely is all that tract or parcel of land situated in New Windsor District in Carroll County in the State of Maryland, containing 185½ acres of land, more or less, and being the same land devised to Florence E. Stitely by the last will and testament of George Lambert, dated June 16, 1900 and recorded among the Will Records of Carroll County in Liber W. A. No. 11, folio 23 etc.

4. That said taxes being due and in arrears, the said C. Robert Brillhart, Collector as aforesaid, on the 23rd day of May, 1934, gave notice in writing that said taxes were due and in arrears and that unless the same were paid within thirty days from the date thereof, the said Collector would proceed to collect the same according to law, a duplicate copy of which said notice is herewith filed as part hereof, marked Exhibit No. 1.

5. That the said State and County taxes remained unpaid after the expiration of thirty days and the said C. Robert Brillhart, Collector as aforesaid, thereupon on the ___ day of June, 1935, entered on, levied upon and took in execution the real estate hereinbefore described for the purpose of collecting said State and County taxes, and the said Collector caused the same to be appraised by George C. Fowble and Jesse L. Stoner, which appraisal and schedule of said property is herewith filed marked Exhibit No. 2.

6. That said taxes not having been paid, the said C. Robert Brillhart, Collector as aforesaid, advertised said property for sale at public auction by giving more than twenty days' notice of the time, place, manner and terms of sale by advertisement
