

Burns W. Compber, one fifth to Mary E. Michael and one fifth to Leola V. Zecher.

FIFTH. That there is now due and owing from the said Louisa V. Compber and her estate the sum of \$178.00 unto your Complainant for services rendered in preparing her body and burial of the said Louisa V. Compber a sworn to account of the same being filed herewith and marked "Exhibit B" which your Complainant prays may be taken and considered as a part hereof.

SIXTH. That letters of administration have not been granted in the estate of the said Louisa V. Compber and she did not leave any personal property other than personal effects such as clothes.

SEVENTH. That your Oratrix is informed and believes that the said personal estate is not sufficient to discharge any of the just debts due and owing by the said intestate Louisa V. Compber.

TO THE END THEREFORE:

1st. That your Honors will pass the decree of your Honorable Court, that the real estate of the said Louisa V. Compber, deceased, may be sold for the payment of the amount of money due unto your Oratrix and any other creditor or creditors of the said Louisa V. Compber.

2nd. That your Honors will appoint a Trustee or Trustees to make sale on said real estate of the said Louisa V. Compber, for the purpose of carrying out the decree of your Honorable Court in the premises.

3rd. That your Oratrix may have such other and further relief as her case may require.

May it please your Honors to grant unto your Oratrix the writs of subpoena directed to the said Ella M. Moser and Alpha T. Moser, her husband, Wesley M. Compber and Clara M. Compber, his wife, Burns W. Compber and Harriet Compber, his wife, Leola V. Zecher and George F. Zecher, her husband, all of Frederick County, Maryland and Mary E. Michael and Maurice W. Michael, her husband, of LaPlata, Charles County, Maryland, requiring them and each of them to be in your Honorable Court on some day certain to be named therein, and show cause if any they may have why the relief prayed should not be granted.

At the request of Samuel W. Compber and wife the following Deed is Received for Record and Recorded April 27th. 1910 at 9 o'clk A. M.

This Deed made this 29th day of March in the year nineteen hundred and ten by Henrietta Biser, widow, of Frederick County, State of Maryland.

Witnesseth:- That for and in consideration of the sum of One Thousand Dollars, cash in hand the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, I the said Henrietta Biser, do hereby grant and convey, in fee simple to Samuel W. Compber and Louisa V. Compber, his wife and their successors, all that lot or parcel of ground and premises, together with the improvements thereon and the rights and appurtenances thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining. Situated in the Village of Burkittsville in Frederick County, State of Maryland, and contained within the following metes and bounds, Beginning ata point on the North side of the Main Street, in said town, S. 64 degrees W. 19 links from the West corner of the brick house on said lot and running thence N. 49 degrees E. 16 8/10 perches, to the N. E. side of the Alley in the rear of said lot then with said alley
