The family relationships are, I believe, correctly set out in the Bill of Complaint. My brother, Scott L. Fry died without a will. I do not see that the real estate of which my father died seised can be divided without loss or injury among the parties interested, and my reason for saying this is that it would be impossible to divide the house and land satisfactorily. If this real estate be sold the profits can be divided according to the interest of each one."
