TESTIMONY

taken before the Court, Hon. Arthur D. Willard, Dec. 29, 1936.

P. LUTHER RICE, being first duly sworn, deposes and says: By Mr. Bowers:

Q. Mr. Rice, you are the same witness who testified sometime ago before the Examiner in this case, are you not?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. (The Court) You are familiar with this property in question described in this case?
