

A. Well that is for Mrs. Poole. I paid Mr. Poole's claim. Of course they owe me. I paid that out of the rent.

Q. (Mr. Wood) But you would be subrogated for that against the estate, which makes it just the same. How much was that?

A. \$290.

Q. That was Charles' bill?

A. I paid all the bills, taxes and everything up-to-date; have Uncle Charles all paid. I have in the neighborhood of \$200.00 on hand that I counted from the rent.

Q. And you have also given clothes and stuff to George out of the rent?

A. Yes, I am giving George what money he needs and taking clothes down to him. Everything is included in an itemized list I have.

Q. (Mr. Bowers) Wasn't the original bill of Cline's against your Uncle Charles \$400, and Mrs. Poole, his widow, paid a part of it?

A. \$100 or so, yes.

Q. And you have paid the balance of it from Mr. Poole's estate?

A. From the income of his estate - from the rent from the houses. I paid the bills from the sale of the personal property and the rent from the houses.

Q. (The Court) You claim that then as Administrator against this real estate, do you?

A. Yes sir.

Q. How much is that you claim?

A. I think it is about \$250 or \$300, something like that all told.

Q. (Mr. Wood) Didn't you pay Cline \$290?

A. Yes, two hundred and some dollars. I paid him the balance. You see there was a lot of back taxes, water rent, insurance and everything. I paid everything on the property right up-to-date. I paid it from the income of the property. Don't misunderstand me, I didn't take it out of my pocket. I paid it from the income from the property. I have a balance yet due the property from the income of maybe a hundred and some dollars - between \$100 and \$200.

Q. (Mr. Bowers) You recall about the claim of Dr. Bourne of \$104, don't you?

A. Never been presented to me. Why didn't that come in before we settled with the Orphans Court?

Q. It is filed over there?

A. Shouldn't that have come in when they were settling with the Orphans Court? It never was presented.

Q. You have not stated your final account with the Orphans Court?

A. Yes, I settled up with them and you were with me, and paid you your fee.

Q. Well that is right.

A. I settled up with the Orphans Court for everything and I have a list made out what the estate was.

Q. (Mr. Wood) You never collected anything before the old man died?

A. No, I collected everything since I have been appointed by the Orphans Court; sold the personal property and collected the rent.

Q. Mr. Poole, you know about the claim of Mrs. Ida Pomeroy?

A. Yes, I know that. That is what caused the trouble. What happened to that?

Q. Her claim has been filed in the Orphans Court and has not been paid, has it? A. No.

Q. And Dr. Williams as Executor of the estate of Mrs. Poole and you as Administrator of the estate of Charles Poole, have agreed with Mrs. Pomeroy to adjust her claim for \$750, is that right?

A. That's right.

Q. And that's never been done?

A. Well I agreed but I don't think the Doctor ever agreed to it.
