

Q. Well I think he agreed, or will agree.

Q. How much of the \$750 compromise were you as Administrator to pay?

A. \$250.

Q. And Dr. Williams as Executor was to pay the remaining \$500?

A. Yes.

Q. Mr. Poole, in your statement of account in the Orphans Court you have not taken care of the claim of Dr. Bourne of \$104, and one of Kennedy's of \$10.87, nor have you taken account of that \$250 for Ida Pomeroy, have you? A. No.

Q. Nor for one-third of the estate due to the Executor of the estate of Victoria Poole, have you? A. No.

Q. Will you file a copy of the Claims filed against the estate of Charles A. Poole and also a copy of your statement of account in this case with the Orphans Court?

A. Yes.

Q. Based upon these claims just itemized: Kennedys, \$10.87, \$210 for the Cline funeral bill and \$104 for Dr. Bourne and \$250 as your portion of the Pomeroy settlement, and approximately \$1250 due as the third to the estate of Victoria M. Poole, making a total of approximately \$1850, besides the costs of these proceedings, what have you to say as to how they can be paid or adjusted without a sale of all of the property of which Charles A. Poole died seized and possessed? The costs of the proceedings will be three or four hundred dollars added to that.

A. You couldn't offer those houses, say the lot and one house, then hold the other one, could you?
