Remsberg, unmarried, resident of Frederick County, in the State of Maryland;-WITNESSETH, That for and in consideration of the sum of Ten (\$10.00) Dollars, in current money, and other good valuable considerations, this date paid unto me by Grover J. Beck and Elizabeth Beck, his wife, residents of Frederick County, in the State of Maryland, before the execution and delivery of this Deed, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, I, the said Gerald G. Remsberg, do hereby grant and convey unto the said Grover J. Beck and Elizabeth Beck, his wife, all that house and lot of ground, situated, lying and being on the East side of the Main Street, or Public Turnpike Road, in the Town of Woodsboro, in Frederick County, State of Maryland, being the same real estate of which Emma V.
