

Q What was the amount of money? A. \$3950.

Q And interest from when?

A Interest was paid up till the first day of May, 1936; since then interest is \$189.27.

Q Interest was paid up to May 1, 1936? A. Yes, sir.

(Certified copy of judgment offered and filed in evidence, marked Exhibit No. 1)

Q Has that been paid?

A No, sir.

Q Or any part of it? A No, sir.

Q Did she leave any personal property in Maryland that you know of?

A No, sir, none that I know of.

Q At the time of her death she was seized of what property?

A Property located at Woodsboro.

Q Does this accurately describe the property, being the paper writing described as Exhibit No. 2 which was filed with the bill of complaint, being deed from Gerald G. Remsberg to Grover J. Beck and Elizabeth Beck, his wife?

A Yes, that is the same property.

(Paper referred to offered and filed in evidence, marked Exhibit No. 2).

Q And that consists of what?

A Dwelling house, store, lunchroom and garages.

Q And located where?

A On Main Street in Woodsboro.

Q That is right near the bank, is it not?

A Next block down - next corner.

Q What would be your valuation on it? What do you think is a fair market value of that property?

A \$3800 or \$4000, along in there.

Q Between \$3800 and \$4000? A. Yes.

Q What became of Grover J. Beck? A. He is dead.

Q That was the husband of Elizabeth Beck? A. Yes.

(Certified copy of will of Elizabeth Beck, marked Exhibit No. 3 to the bill of complaint, and certified copy of will of Elizabeth A. Yeager, marked Exhibit No. 4 to the bill of complaint, offered and filed in evidence, marked Exhibits Nos. 3 and 4, respectively).

Q Are the defendants in this case adults, Mr. Albaugh?

A Yes sir.

Q All adults? A. Yes sir.

Q Are they the only ones interested in this?

A Yes, that I know of.

Q Do you know the names of the devisees? A. No, sir.

Q Have you had any correspondence with any of them?

A No, sir.

Q Which one has been to the bank?

A Mr. Fetrow, husband of Mrs. Fetrow, she was one of them.

Q And you have had communications with him?

A With him, yes.

Q Do you know whether or not either of the other ladies who are devisees under Mrs. Beck's will are dead? A. One is.

Q Do you recall her name?

A I don't know whether Mrs. Yeager, or the other lady.
