

Townsend, whose husband's name is Hugh S. Townsend, and Mary Dick, whose husband's name is Robert Dick.

(4) That no administration has been had upon the estate of the said Samuel C. Brown because he died without personal property.

(5) That the said Samuel C. Brown died seized and possessed of all that real estate in these proceedings more particularly described and sold, and the Trustees in this cause, Leslie N. Coblentz and William M. Storm, now hold in their hands the proceeds of the sale of said real estate, the sum of Eight Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$850.00).

(6) That since there is no personal estate, your Petitioner is informed and believes that the cash now in the hands of the Trustees aforesaid ought to be applied to the payment of the claim of your Petitioner as well as the claims of all other creditors of the said Samuel C. Brown.

TO THE END, THEREFORE,

(a) That the aforesaid proceeds of the sale of real estate in the sum of Eight Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$850.00) or as much thereof as may be necessary for the purpose, may be applied to the payment of the debts of the said decedent, Samuel C. Brown, and

(b) That your Orators may have such other and further relief as their case may require.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR HONORS to grant the writ of subpoena directed against the said Marie A. Townsend and Hugh S. Townsend and Mary Dick and Robert Dick commanding them to be and appear in this Court at some certain day, to be named herein, and answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree as may be passed herein.
