

- Q. State whether or not Mr. Brown left surviving him a wife.
- A. His wife had died before he died.
- Q. How many children were born to this marriage?
- A. One. Mary Brown, who is now Mrs. Dick, wife of Robert Dick.
- Q. Was he married previously?
- A. Yes, he was married before.
- Q. How many children were born to the prior marriage?
- A. One. Marie Brown, who is now Mrs. Townsend, wife of Hugh S. Townsend.
- Q. Was he married more than twice?
- A. No, that's all.
- Q. Do you know whether Mr. Brown owed anybody else money or notes or accounts at the time of his death?
- A. Not of my own knowledge, but I have heard of other debts.
- Q. What was the date of Samuel Brown's death?
- A. February 5, 1936.
- Q. Did you receive any interest on this note?
- A. No, sir.
- Q. Do you know whether or not there has been any administration made on Samuel Brown's estate, that is, whether an Administrator has been appointed by the Orphans' Court? Do you know whether or not that is true?
- A. Not that I know of.
- Q. Do you know, or can you state any other matter or thing which may be of benefit or advantage to the parties to this cause, or either of them, or that may be material to the subject of this, your examination, or the matters in question between the parties?
- A. Nothing further.

Mary Anna Brown

Mrs. Robert Dick, a witness of lawful age, called by the Petitioner, deposes and says as follows:

- Q. State your name, age and place of residence.
- A. Mrs. Robert Dick, age twenty-three, Sabillasville, Maryland.
- Q. Your husband's name is what?
- A. Mr. Robert Dick.
- Q. You are the daughter of Samuel C. Brown?
- A. Yes, sir.
- Q. State the date of his death.
- A. February 5, 1936.
- Q. State whether or not you lived with him at the time of his death.
- A. I did live with him.
- Q. State if you know whether Mr. Brown owned any personal property, such as furniture, tools, or stocks and bonds, at the time of his death.
- A. No, nothing but a few carpenter's tools which was sold when grandmother had sale.
- Q. Can you state the approximate value of those tools?
- A. Not over \$10.00.
- Q. Mrs. Dick, do you know whether or not any administration has been had on your father's estate?
- A. No, there were no assets to be administered upon.
- Q. Do you have any brothers or sisters?
- A. No, except a sister by a prior marriage of my father.
- Q. How many times was your father married?
- A. Twice.
