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TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

In compliance with notice given me by the solicitor for the complainant, I, Walter E. Sinn, one of the standing examiners of Your Honorable Court, did on the third day of June, Nineteen Hundred and Thirty-six, at the law offices of David C. Winebrenner 3d, Esq., in Frederick City, Frederick County, State of Maryland, at the hour of two o'clock P. M., proceed to take the following depositions of the witnesses in this cause then and there produced before me ex parte, that is to say: Present, Mr. David C. Winebrenner 3d, solicitor for the complainant; Mr. Sherman P. Bowers, solicitor for the defendant, Harry M. Feaga, administrator of the estate of Frank Bruchey, deceased.

Samuel R. Ridgeway, a witness of lawful age produced on the part of the complainant, having been first duly sworn, deposes and says:

By Mr. Winebrenner:

Q. Please give your name, age and place of residence.

A. My name is Samuel R. Ridgeway. I am 71 years of age and I reside at Lovettsville, Virginia.

Q. Did you know the late Frank Bruchey and, if so, for how long?

A. Yes. He was my son-in-law and I had known him for fourteen or fifteen years.

Q. At the time of the death of Mr. Bruchey did he owe you any money?

A. Yes, he owed me at the time of his death \$490.00 as evidenced by his promissory note in the amount of \$500.00 dated February 27, 1936 and payable to my order on demand, less a payment of \$10.00.

Q. Was it an interest bearing note?

A. Yes.

Q. Did you file this note as a claim against Mr. Bruchey's estate in the Orphans' Court for Frederick County, Maryland?

A. Yes.

Q. Is this the note by which Mr. Bruchey's indebtedness to you is evidenced?

A. Yes.
