

thereon to accrue in any part or either of them, at the time limited for the payment of the same, and said default shall continue for Ninety days, or in default of any agreement, covenant or condition of this mortgage, then the entire mortgage debt shall be deemed due and demandable at the option of the Mortgagee and it shall be lawful for the Mortgagee or its assigns, or John I. Rowe and Joseph B. Mish, or either of them, at any time after such default to sell the mortgaged property or so much thereof as may be necessary, to satisfy and pay said debt, interest charges and all costs incurred in making such sale, (under Art. 66, Secs. 6 to 10 of the Maryland Code, Public General Laws, or any other General or Local Laws relating to Mortgages) and to grant and convey said property to the purchaser or purchasers thereof, his, her or their heirs, personal representatives or assigns, and which sale shall be made in the manner following, viz., upon giving twenty days' notice of the time, place, manner and terms of sale, in a newspaper printed in Frederick County, and such other notice as by the Mortgagee or its assigns, may be deemed expedient; and in the event of a sale of said property under the assent to decree or powers hereby granted, the proceeds arising from such sale, to apply, first, to the payment of all expenses incident to such sale, including a fee of Twenty-five (25) Dollars, and a commission to the party making sale of said property equal to the commission allowed trustees for making sale of property by virtue of a decree of a Court having equity jurisdiction in the State of Maryland; secondly, to the payment of all claims of the Mortgagee under this Mortgage, whether the same shall have matured or not, and the surplus (if any) shall be paid to the Mortgagors, or to whomever may be entitled thereto.

The Mortgagors do hereby covenant and agree that immediately upon the first insertion of the advertisement or notice of sale as aforesaid under the powers hereby granted, or under the assent to decree as hereinbefore set forth, there shall be and become due by them to the party inserting said advertisement or notice, all expenses incident to said advertisement or notice, all Court costs and all expenses incident to the foreclosure proceedings under this Mortgage and a commission on the total amount of the Mortgage debt, principal and interest, equal to one-half the percentage allowed as commission to trustees making sale under orders or decrees of a Court having equity jurisdiction in the State of Maryland, which expenses, costs and commission the Mortgagors do hereby covenant to pay and the Mortgagee or its assigns, or John I. Rowe and Joseph D. Mish, or either of them, shall not be required to receive the principal and interest only of said Mortgage debt in satisfaction thereof, unless the same be accompanied by a tender of said expenses, costs and commission, but said sale may be proceeded with, unless prior to the day appointed therefor legal tender be made of said principal, costs, expenses and commission.

AND the Mortgagors further covenant to warrant specially said property and to execute such further assurances thereof as may be requisite.

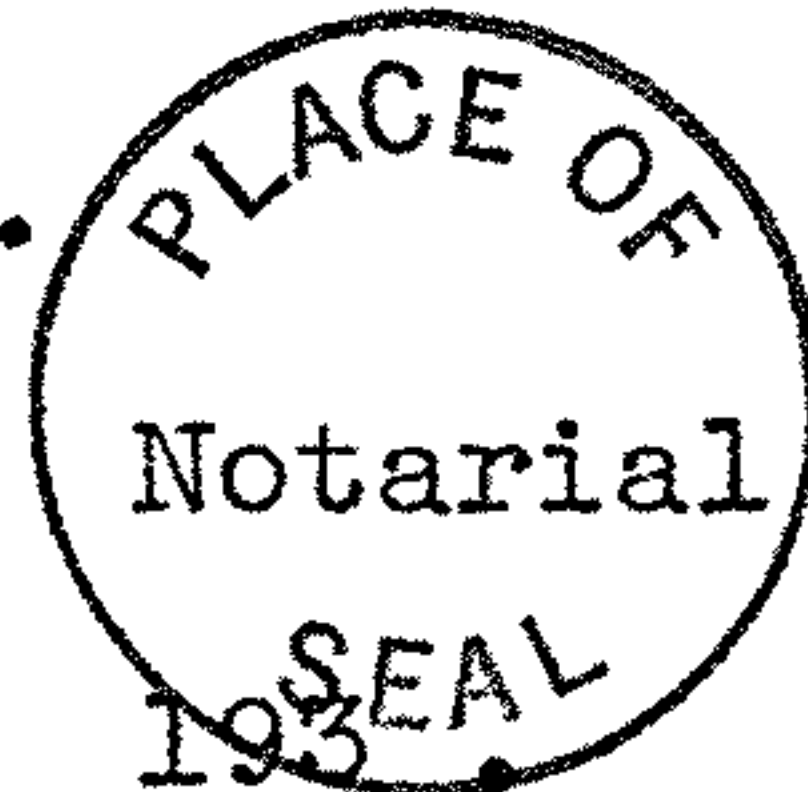
