

bearing date June 13, 1931, a certified copy of which judgment is filed herewith marked Exhibit No. 1 to this Bill of Complaint, which together with all other Exhibits Complainant prays may be taken and considered as a part hereof.

SECOND: That the said Marcella Lewis left no personal property and no Letters of Administration were ever issued on her said estate, and your Complainant avers that it is entitled to have its claim paid out of the real estate of which the said Marcella Lewis died seized and possessed.

THIRD: That the said Marcella Lewis was seized in FEE SIMPLE at the time of her death of all that parcel of land containing two and one-half acres and ten square perches of land lying and being near Cedar Grove School House along the public road leading from Liberty to Woodsboro and described in a deed from Oliver H. Fogle and Clara B. Fogle, his wife, to Marcella Lewis, dated November 26, 1910, and recorded in Liber No. 294, folio 272, one of the Land Records for Frederick County, a certified copy of which is filed herewith marked Exhibit No. 2.

FOURTH: That the said Marcella Lewis left surviving her as her heirs at law and next of kin a son Ephraim Tucker, who resides with Edward Boozer near Woodsboro, Frederick County, Maryland, and a son Harry Lewis, who resides in Frederick City, Frederick County, Maryland. The above described property having vested in the children of the said Marcella Lewis subject to the debts due and owing at the time of her death.

TO THE END, THEREFORE,

1st. That the real estate of the said Marcella Lewis or so much thereof as may be necessary be sold for the payment of the claim of your Complainant and of other unpaid creditors of the decedent.

2nd. That any excess may be properly distributed among those legally entitled thereto.

3rd. That a Trustee may be appointed by your Honorable Court to make such sale.

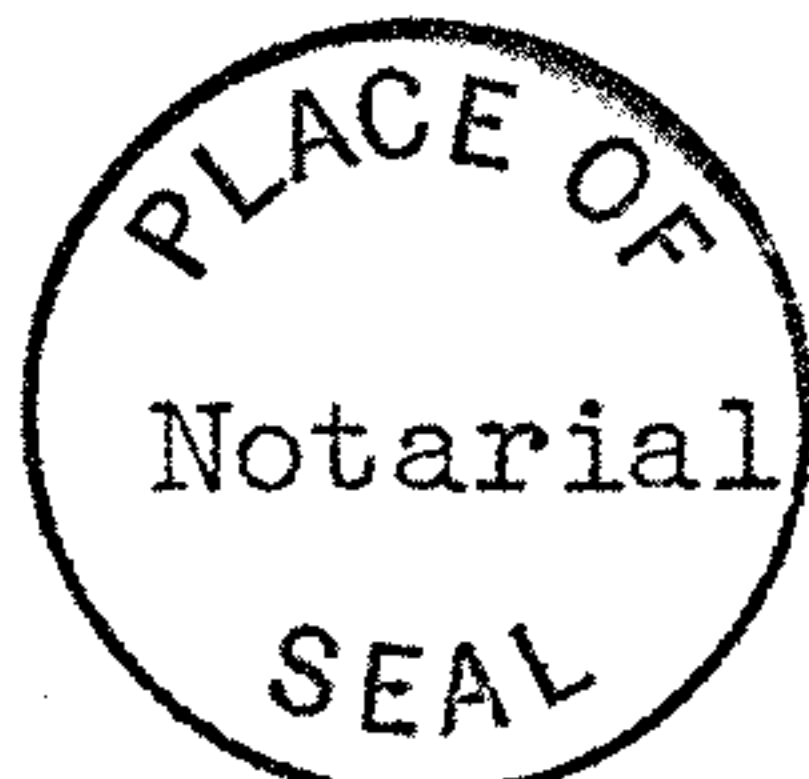
4th. And for such other and further relief as the nature of the case may require.

May it please your Honors to grant unto your Complainant the Writ of Subpoena directed to the said Ephraim Tucker near Woodsboro, Frederick County, Maryland, residing with Edward Boozer, and Harry Lewis, of Frederick, Maryland, commanding them to be and appear in your Honorable Court on some day certain to be named therein, to answer the premises and abide by and perform such Decree as may be passed therein.
