TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

The petition of Fannie L. Sulcer, widow, Verda V. Sulcer, unmarried, Ernest F. Sulcer and Agnes Sulcer, his wife, Mabel V. Marsh and Mason Marsh, her husband, M. Viola Sulcer, widow, individually, and M. Viola Sulcer, next friend of Margaret LaRue Sulcer and Velma Lucille Sulcer, infants, respectfully shows unto your Honors:

1. That on the 3rd day of November, 1937, your Petitioners filed in your Honorable Court a petition against Margaret LaRue Sulcer and Velma Lucille Sulcer, infants, praying that your Honorable Court might ratify and confirm a Contract of Sale made on behalf of said infant Defendants.
