Mercer, conveying the said real estate to the said Harriet Virginia Carey and your Respondent, as joint tenants; further answering said paragraph the Defendant denies that he demanded her discharge from the said County Home or that he exercised any influence which caused the said Harriet Virginia Carey to execute a deed and furthering answering said paragraph says, that the said Harriet Virginia Carey was released from the said County Home upon her own request and under the advice of her physician.

NINTH. Answering the tenth paragraph of said Bill of Complaint your Respondent most indignantly denies the allegations therein set forth.

TENTH. Answering the eleventh paragraph of said Bill of Complaint your Respondent denies that the Complainant has any right or interest in the property therein referred to.

WHEREFORE this Respondent, having fully answered, prays your Honors that the Bill of Complaint filed against him may be hence dismissed, with his reasonable costs.

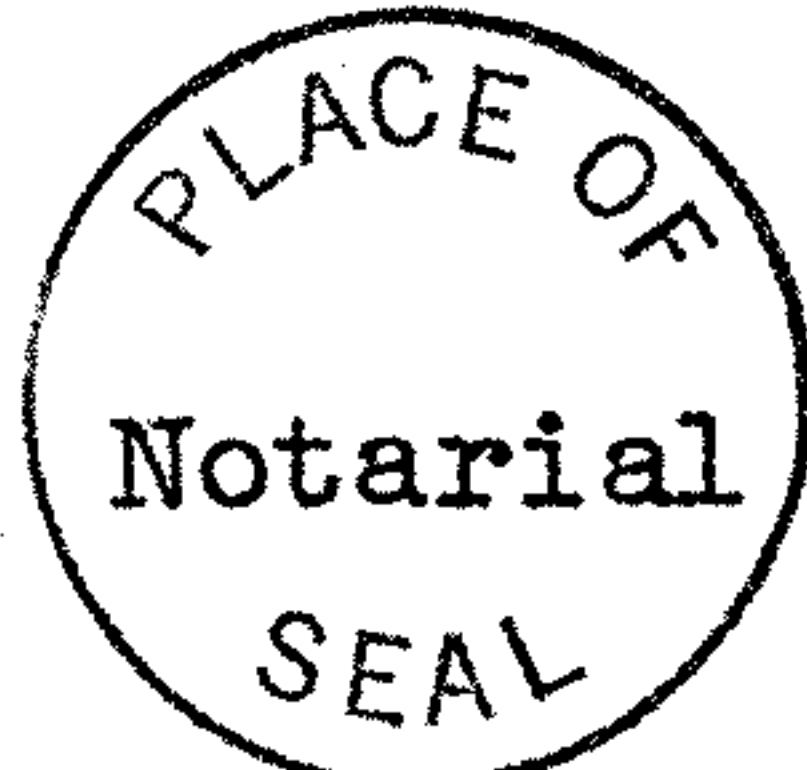

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

Your Petitioner, Marie Wolf, respectfully represents unto your Honors:

FIRST: That your Petitioner nursed, cared for and attended the said Harriet V. Carey, late of Frederick County, deceased, six weeks prior to her death, for which services she is entitled to the sum of One Hundred Eighty Dollars (\$180), a copy of statement covering said services, which was duly probated in the Orphans' Court for Frederick County, is herewith filed as Exhibit "Claim" and prayed to be considered as a part hereof.

SECOND: That this Petition is filed on behalf of herself and of all the creditors of the deceased who come in and contribute to the expenses of the suit.
