

(2) That the usual process was issued commanding the Defendants named in said original Bill of Complaint to appear in your Honorable Court on the first Monday of December, 1936, and to answer the said Bill within fifteen (15) days from the return day aforementioned, and the said Defendants, having failed to answer said Bill of Complaint as commanded, your Honorable Court did on the 22nd day of January, 1937, decree that the said Bill of Complaint be taken pro confesso against the Defendants named therein.

(3) That subsequent to the passage of said decree pro confesso and prior to the return of the testimony by Patrick M. Schnauffer, Esq., Examiner in this cause, Willis G. Black, one of the Defendants named in the original Bill of Complaint died leaving surviving him his widow, Maude E. Black, and three infant children, to-wit: Harry G. Black, Elmer Lee Black and Betty K. Black.

(4) That prior to the death of the said Willis G. Black no final decree had been passed in this cause.

WHEREFORE, your Petitioners pray that your Honorable Court will grant leave to amend the said original Bill of Complaint by making the said infant children of the late Willis G. Black parties Defendant to this proceeding, and that the usual process may be issued commanding their appearance in this cause in accordance with the rules of your Honorable Court, and for such other and further relief as the nature of the case may require.

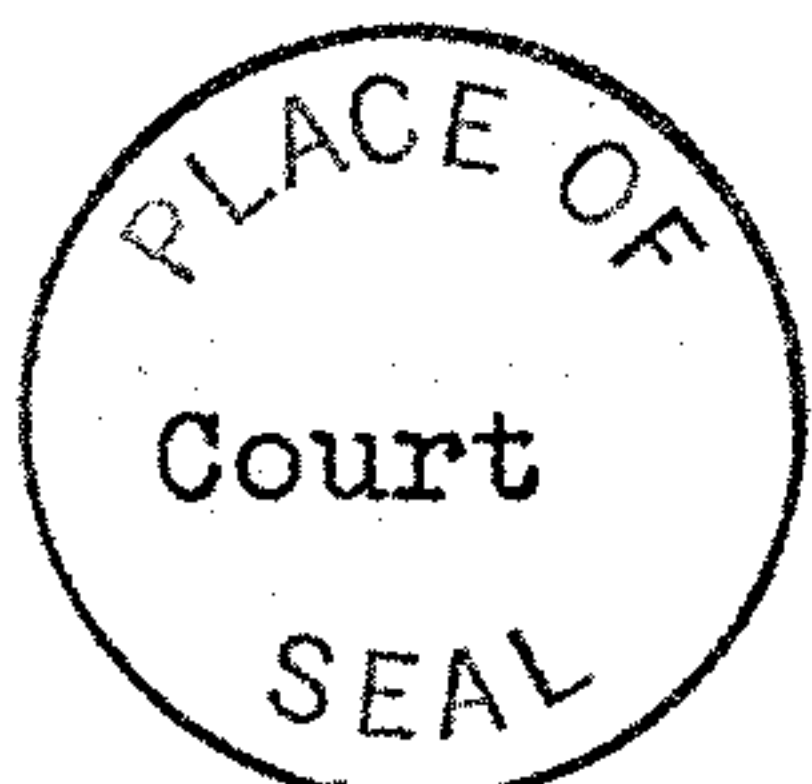
