Black, hereinbefore mentioned, after the deduction of all proper costs and expenses incurred in these proceedings, be paid by the said Trustee unto Morris G. Black, Administrator of the estate of the late W. Geyer Black, for the purpose of paying the debts of the said W. Geyer Black, as shown in the copy of the First and Final Account of Morris G. Black, Administrator of the goods and chattels of W. Geyer Black, deceased, approved by the Orphan's Court for Frederick County, and filed in this proceeding, EXCEPTING, HOWEVER, so much thereof as shall constitute the interest and distributive share of Robert Fraley, infant, in the portion of said fund remaining available for the payment of the account to Hammaker Brothers for a tombstone, after allowing for the payment in full of the accounts to Wilhide & Creager, remaining due for funeral expenses of the said W. Geyer Black and Maggie E. Black, respectively, which said interest and distributive share shall be audited and paid to the said Robert Fraley, infant, all subject to exception.

And it is further ordered that the papers and proceedings in this cause be referred to D. Princeton Buckey, Esq., Auditor, for the purpose of stating an account in accordance with the provisions of this order.
