Your Orators complaining say:

1st. That Elmer F. Bussard is one of the remaindermen under the will of Peter H. Bussard, deceased, as hereinafter set forth, and that Mamie L. Bussard, is his wife.

2nd. That Peter H. Bussard died a resident of Frederick County, Maryland prior to May 5, 1905, leaving a will duly probated in Liber W.B.C. #1, folio 117, one of the Records of Wills in the office of the Register of Wills for Frederick County; certified copy of which will is filed herewith, prayed to be taken as a part hereof and marked "Exhibit A".

3rd. That Peter H. Bussard died seised and possessed of certain real estate described as follows:-

(1) In a deed from Mary Lamar to Peter H. Bussard, dated April 18th, 1856, recorded in Liber E. S. 8, Folio 464 etc., One of the Land Records of Frederick County; certified copy of which deed is filed herewith, prayed to be taken as a part hereof, and marked "Exhibit B"., containing 180 $\frac{1}{4}$ acres of land more or less, deducting therefrom 21 acres, 3 roods and 12 square perches of land more or less, conveyed unto Henry Coblentz by Peter H. Bussard and wife by deed dated 12th day of September, 1878; certified copy of which deed is filed herewith, prayed to be taken as a part hereof, and marked "Exhibit C".

(2) In a deed from John T. Sinn and wife to Peter H. Bussard dated Sept. 11, 1877 and recorded in Liber T.G. No. 8, folio 431, one of the land records of Frederick County, Md., containing 32 $\frac{5}{8}$ acres, more or less; certified copy of which deed is filed herewith, prayed to be taken as a part hereof, and marked "Exhibit D".

(3) In a deed from Nicholas P. Baer and wife to Peter H. Bussard dated April 4, 1878 and recorded in Liber No. 10 (T.G.), folio 173, one of the Land Records of Frederick County, Md., containing 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres of land, more or less; certified copy of which deed is filed herewith, prayed to be taken as a part hereof, and marked "Exhibit E".

(4) In a deed from Robert Pettingall and wife to Peter H. Bussard dated Dec. 6, 1873 and recorded in Liber T. G. No. 1, folio 8, one of the Land Records of Frederick County, Md., certified copy of which deed is filed herewith, prayed to be taken as a part hereof, and marked "Exhibit F"; containing 32 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres of land, more or less, less 13 $\frac{11}{16}$ acres conveyed by Peter H. Bussard and wife to John H. Ropp by deed dated August 16, 1900, recorded in Liber S.T.H. No. 271, Folio 161, one of the Land Records of Frederick County certified copy of which is filed herewith, prayed to be taken as a part hereof, and marked "Exhibit G".

4th. That by the third paragraph of said will, Peter H. Bussard devised the aforesaid real estate as follows:

"Third:

I give and bequeath unto my sons, John W. Bussard, Peter E. Bussard, Joseph H. Bussard, Daniel L. Bussard, Samuel D. Bussard, and to the survivors of them, in trust nevertheless, the home farm where I now reside, (reserving however for the use and benefit of my said wife, Charlotte M. the use of three rooms in my dwelling house on said farm, also the use of part of the cellar, the Spring House and Wash House on said farm for such purposes as my said wife shall desire, which I give and devise to her during the term of her natural life should she desire to use them) together with the Mountain land described in this paragraph of my will, said farm and Mountain land being described in the following
