

At the time of his death he owned a Lot of ground fronting on Maple Avenue in Brunswick which he got from R. J. Stup and wife in 1891. Exhibit A filed with the Bill of Complaint which I now look at, correctly describes said Lot. Said Lot is worth about \$400.-

Letters of administration on the personal estate of the said Willoughby N. Lemen were granted by The Orphans' Court of Frederick County, Md. to his his brother Thomas T. Lemen who is proceeding to administer the personal estate of the said decedent. The personal estate of the said decedent amounted to only a little over \$300.- and I understand that the said personal estate will not be sufficient to pay all his debts, funeral expenses and costs of administration.

Thomas T. Lemen a witness of lawful age produced on the part of the Plaintiff being duly sworn and examined viva voce deposes and says as follows:-

My name is Thomas T. Lemen, my age 50 years; I reside at Martinsburg, West Va. I am a brother of Willoughby N. Lemen, the decedent mentioned in this case; and was appointed administrator of the goods and chattels of the said decedent, by the Orphans Court of Frederick County, Md. and duly qualified as such, and am now engaged in administering said estate.

My brother at the time of his death was indebted unto Jeremiah P. Karn for lumber and materials and I believe the correct amount of the same is \$22.02. Said bill has not been paid Mr. Karn yet.

The personal estate of the said Willoughby N. Lemen amounted to \$316.50 of which the widow took \$150.00 at its appraised value. The said personal estate will fall short of paying his just debts by about \$150.- not counting the Court costs. There costs will make the deficiency still greater. My brother at the time of his death owned an unimproved lot of ground in Brunswick described in Exhibit A filed with this Bill in this cause, worth between \$400 & \$500 which I believe would bring enough to pay off the balance of his indebtedness after application of the personal estate. The widow and the infant child of my brother mentioned by the preceding witness are the only ones interested in said real estate.
