

in Washington, District of Columbia. she being a daughter of Daisy Baker, a daughter of Martha A. Toms, who died intestate on or about January 15, 1926 whose husband was George Baker, he also died intestate on or about the 4th day of March, 1916;

Hubert Faulder, unmarried, a grandson who resides near Boonsboro, Washington County, Maryland, he being a son of Annie Faulder a daughter of Martha A. Toms who died intestate on or about September 10, 1929 the wife of Joshua Faulder, who lives near Boonsboro, Washington County, Maryland.

J. Stanley Toms, Jr., a grandson, infant under the age of 21, who lives at Wittman, Talbot County, Maryland, a son of J. Stanley Toms who died on or about June 14, 1918, whose wife's name is Mary Toms and who resides at Wittman, Talbot County, Maryland.

THIRD: That there is now due and owing from the said Martha A. Toms and her estate the sum of Two hundred forty-six and 50/100 Dollars (\$246.50) unto your Complainant for services rendered in preparing her body and burial of the said Martha A. Toms, a sworn to account of the same being filed herewith marked Exhibit "B" which your Complainant prays may be taken and considered as a part hereof.

FOURTH: That no letters of administration have been granted in the estate of the said Martha A. Toms and she did not leave any personal property other than a few personal effects such as clothes, etc; the value of which is less than \$100.00.

FIFTH. That your Oratrix is informed and believes that the said personal effects are not sufficient to discharge any of the just debts due and owing by the said intestate, Martha A. Toms.

To the end therefore:

1st. That your Honors will pass the decree of your Honorable Court that the real estate of the said Martha A. Toms, deceased, may be sold for the payment of the amount of money due unto your Orator and any other creditor or creditors of the said Martha A. Toms.

2nd. That your Honors will appoint a Trustee or Trustees to make sale of said real estate of the said Martha A. Toms for the purpose of carrying out the decree of your Honorable Court.

3rd. And for such other and further relief as may be required by the nature of this case.

And your Petitioner prays for the following process:

That the writ of subpoena may be issued out of your Honorable Court directed to the said Olive A. Recher and John L. Recher, her husband who reside near Thurmont, Frederick County, Maryland, Brinton Toms and Grace Toms his wife who reside at Thurmont, Frederick County, Maryland; Olivia Myers and John Myers, her husband, who live at Glen Cove, Baltimore County, Maryland; Hubert Faulder who resides at Boonsboro, Washington County, Maryland and J. Stanley Toms, Jr., Infant, who resides at Wittman, Talbot County, Maryland commanding them and each of them to be and appear in your Honorable Court in person or by solicitor on some day certain to be named therein to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree as may be passed therein.

And your Petitioner prays for the further process:

That an Order of Publication may be passed by your Honorable Court to be published in some Newspaper in Frederick County, Maryland giving notice to the non-resident Defendants of the object and substance of the Bill of Complaint warning them to be and appear in person or by Solicitor in this Court on some certain day to be named therein and show cause if any, they have why the relief sought should not be granted.
