

Wellington Toms, whose wife's name is Jettie Toms, who resides at Waynesboro, in the State of Pennsylvania.

Mildred Begomia, a granddaughter, whose husband's name is A. Keller Begomia, who reside in Washington, District of Columbia she being a daughter of Daisy Baker, a daughter of Martha A. Toms, who died intestate on or about January 15, 1926, whose husband was George Baker, he also died intestate on or about the 4th day of March 1916;

Hubert Faulder, unmarried, a grandson sho resides near Boonsboro, Washington County, Maryland, he being a son of Annie Faulder, a daughter of Martha A. Toms, who died intestate on or about September 10, 1929 the wife of Joshua Faulder, who lives near Boonsboro, Washington County, Maryland.

J. Stanley Toms, Jr., a grandson, infant under the age of 21, who lives at Wittman, Talbot County, Maryland, a son of J. Stanley Toms who died on or about June 14, 1918, whose wife's name is Mary Toms and who resides at Wittman, Talbot County, Maryland.

That there is due and owing from the said Martha A. Toms and her estate to the Complainant the sum of \$246.50 for services rendered.

That no letters of administration have been granted in the estate of Martha A. Toms, and that she did not leave personal property in excess of the value of \$100.00, and said personal estate is not sufficient to discharge any of the just debts due and owing by said intestate, Martha A. Toms.

The Bill prays that a decree be passed for the sale of the real estate of Martha A. Toms, deceased and for the payment of the amount due to the Complainant herein and any other creditors of the said Martha A. Toms.

The Bill further prays that a Trustee or Trustees may be appointed by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity to sell the real estate of the said Martha A. Toms for the purpose of carrying out the decree of the Court; and for such other and further relief as the nature of the case may require.

The Bill prays that an Order of Publication be passed to be published in some newspaper in Frederick County, giving notice to the non-resident parties and Brinton Toms against whom the Court has ordered proceeding be taken as a non resident under Article 16 Section 134 of the annotated Code of Maryland of the object and substance of the Bill and commanding them to appear in person or by solicitor in the Circuit Court for Frederick County, in Equity on some certain day to be named therein and show cause, if any, why the relief should not be granted as prayed.

It is thereupon this 3rd day of March, 1938 by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity and by the authority thereof, ORDERED, that the Plaintiffs, by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some newspaper published in Frederick County, Maryland, once a week for four successive weeks, before the 2nd day of April, 1938, next five notice to the said non-resident Defendants of the object and substance of this bill, warning them to be and appear in this Court by person or by solicitor on or before the 18th day of April, 1938, 1938, to show cause, if any they have, why a decree ought not to pass as prayed.
