

A. My name is George F. Selby, aged 44 years, reside at Brunswick, Maryland, am one of the defendants, and am a son of Joseph A. Selby.

Q. Is your father, Joseph A. Selby, living or dead?

A. He is dead, he died in September, 1934.

Q. Whom did your father leave as his heirs at law, when he died?

A. He left no Widow, as my mother died in 1912, but he left the following children and grandchildren;

(1) A daughter, Bertie Thomas, whose husband's name is Joseph Thomas, and they reside in Baltimore.

(2) A daughter Cora Roberts, who is a widow, living in Hagerstown.

(3) George F. Selby, a son, whose wife's name is Gladys Selby, and residents of Brunswick,

(4) Myrtle Barnes, unmarried, a daughter, living in Brunswick.

(5) Ruth Haller, a daughter, whose husband's name is James Haller, living in Brunswick.

(6) Emory Selby, a son, whose wife's name is Ida Selby.

(7) Helen L. Fauble and Edward F. Fauble, children of Helen Fauble, a deceased daughter, who died in 1930.

(8) Herbert Selby, a son of David Selby, a deceased brother, who died in 1919.

Q. Did your father own any real estate at the time of his death?

A. Yes, the place where he lived. It is a house and lot at the corner of E. Street and 9th Avenue in Brunswick, and is described the deed marked "Exhibit A".

Q. What in your opinion is the property worth?

A. It ought to bring five hundred dollars. It is a six room, frame house with a slate roof and has electric lights but no water.

To the general interrogatory? Some of us wanted to pay off the debt to the Peoples National Bank, but others said we would keep the property up and may be sell it some time, but others, as soon as they got their money they refused to do anything at all.
