

GEORGE F. SELBY, one of the defendants, being first duly sworn, deposes and says:

By Mr. DeLauter:

Q. Your name is George F. Selby? A. Yes, sir.

Q. You live in Brunswick? A. Yes, sir.

Q. You are a son of Joseph A. Selby? A. Yes, sir.

Q. Where did your father live during his lifetime?

A. In Maryland.

Q. He died in Brunswick? A. Yes, sir.

Q. Do you remember when he died?

A. Yes, sir, in 1934.

Q. Did your father own any real estate at the time of his death?

A. Just the home place.

Q. Did your father have any personal property at the time of his death, or not?

A. I just don't remember because I have been away from home for sometime myself.

Q. Did he have any money in bank? A. I don't think so.

Q. And the personal property at home, did that amount to any considerable sum? A. I don't think so.

Q. He was indebted to the Peoples National Bank in the sum of approximately \$275? A. Yes, sir.

Q. Did he have personal property enough to pay his funeral expenses?

A. Well, his Company books show. He had taken his railroad insurance.

Q. Who looked after his funeral expenses - you children?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. (The Court) Was that insurance payable to his estate?

A. No, I have a sister at Baltimore, and she proposed before we got it to raise eighty some dollars apiece to pay it off, and keep it up, maybe some day it would be right good, and after she got hers she thought it best to sell the place, and me and two other sisters took ours and paid off the funeral expenses.

Q. That relief insurance was payable to the children?

A. Yes, sir, to the children.

Q. You children paid these expenses?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Because there was no other money to pay them with? A. No.

Q. Has administration been granted on your father's estate in the Orphans' Court?

A. I believe Mr. Schnauffer - I had him over there a couple years ago. I don't know what he has done.

OSCAR C. SPONSELLER, a witness produced on the part of the plaintiff, being first duly sworn, deposes and says:

By Mr. DeLauter:

Q. Mr. Sponseller, you are Deputy Register of Wills for Frederick County?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Has any administration been granted in your Office on the estate of Joseph A. Selby?

A. There has not.

Q. Of course you don't know any of the whys or wherefores?

A. No, there have been no letters granted in our Office.

GEORGE F. SLELBY (continued):

(Mr. DeLauter)

Q. Do you know what personal estate your father left, that is, furniture, automobile if he had one, and money in bank?

A. Very very little.
