

(3) That this settlement makes due allowance for obligations and debts paid off by the Defendants during their control and occupancy of the church and expenditures made in the operation and upkeep of the church plant, and also makes allowance for rental for the bungalow and for the use of the church claimed by the Complainants, and this settlement is agreed to be in full and final adjustment of all differences and claims whatsoever outstanding of the Complainants against the Defendants or of the Defendants against the Complainants.

WHEREFORE, your Petitioners pray that an order be passed by your Honorable Court supplementing the decree in this cause and approving the settlement and form of accounting aforesaid.

The Bill of Complaint of William H. Summers and Mary L. Summers, his wife, residents of Frederick County, Maryland, respectfully represents unto your Honors:

(1) That Isaac J. Summers, late of Frederick County, Maryland, died in or about the month of June in the year 1903 leaving a last will and testament in which he provided that, after the death of his widow, Lucinda Summers, all his property should be sold and, after the payment of all debts and funeral and necessary expenses, he gave and bequeathed the residue unto each of his children therein named share and share alike in the following language, namely:
