He to sell all and any crops etc of the share due the Estate, collect all moneys for same, pay all taxes and insurance as they become due and payable together with interest on my indebtedness and other necessary expenses to keep a true and correct book account of all sales of produce ect and all moneys paid out and after furnishing my Dear wife with any and all that is necessary for her comfort and convenience, then to pay the remainder upon and to the reduction of my present indebtedness at the end of each year, should payment of my present indebtedness be required prior to the death of my wife, I authorize my son aforenamed and empowere him to borrow an amount equivalent to the amount that may be then due and owing (in the name of my estate) and pay the same off.

Ausherman, intermarried with David E. Ausherman, one sixth. Each child's share to be invested in their name for their benefit, and their children at their demise.
