TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

The Petition of William H. Summers and Mary L. Summers, his wife, the complainants herein, respectfully shows unto your Honors:

(1) That on the 13th day of April, 1939, the complainants filed in your Honorable Court a bill of complaint against William I. Deter et al., defendants, praying for certain relief in the prayer of said bill of complaint set forth.

(2) That answers of all the defendants in the above entitled cause have been filed, assenting to the passage of a decree as prayed, with the exception of the defendant, John McKee.

(3) That a subpoena was duly issued and notice of the said proceedings was served upon the said John McKee, defendant, commanding him to be and appear in your Honorable Court on the first Monday of May, 1939, to answer the aforesaid bill of complaint and to file any other defense which he may have to the proceedings herein within fifteen days from the aforementioned Return Day, and that to date no appearance or any defense has been filed in your Honorable Court by the said defendant, John McKee.

(4) That your petitioners desire to proceed with the case and take testimony in support of the allegations contained in the said bill of complaint.

Wherefore, your petitioners pray that your Honorable Court will order that the said bill of complaint be taken pro confesso against the defendant, John McKee, and that leave may be granted to the complainants to take testimony in this cause.
