DECREE

William T. Allnutt et al.	"	No. 13822 Equity
vs.	"	In the Circuit Court for
Frances E. Allnutt, infant.	"	Frederick County, in Equity.

The above cause having been submitted and the Bill, Answer, testimony and all other proceedings therein having been read and considered, and the Court being of the opinion that it is to the interest and advantage of both the adults and infant parties in the above cause that the contract for the sale of the real estate mentioned and described in these proceedings, made by the adult parties plaintiff, namely William T. Allnutt and Helen R. Allnutt, his wife, Catharine V. Allnutt, unmarried, Georgia Allnutt Oyler and Raymond Oyler, her husband, Mary Allnutt Logan and Martin J. Logan, her husband, and Elizabeth Allnutt, unmarried, and by William T. Allnutt as next friend of and for and on behalf of Frances E. Allnutt, infant party defendant, dated November 18th. 1938, and filed in these proceedings as "Exhibit Agreement" should be confirmed; it is thereupon this 25th day of January, 1939, by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity, and by the authority thereof, adjudged, ordered and decreed that the contract for the sale of the real estate of which George S. Allnutt, late of Frederick County, Maryland, died seized and possessed, made by the adult parties on behalf of themselves and by William T. Allnutt, one of said adult parties, for and on behalf of Frances E. Allnutt, infant, to Parsons Newman, of Frederick City, Frederick County, Maryland, under which said agreement all of the adult parties and the
