

Second: That the said George S. Allnutt left him surviving his widow, Elizabeth D. Allnutt, who has also heretofore departed this life, and the following children, his only heirs at law: William T. Allnutt, whose wife's name is Helen R. Allnutt; Catherine V. Allnutt, unmarried; Georgia Allnut\_ Oyler, whose husband's name is Raymond Oyler; Mary Allnutt Logan, whose husband's name is Martin J. Logan; and Elizabeth Allnutt; unmarried, all of whom are adults above the age of twenty-one years; and a daughter, Frances E. Allnutt, who is now an infant; all of whom are parties to these proceedings.

WHEREFORE, your petitioner prays your Honorable Court to pass an order that the surplus of the proceeds of sale now or about to come into the hands of the Trustees in this cause to be applied to the satisfaction of the debts of George S. Allnutt, deceased, and that an order be passed directing the Trustees in this cause to give notice to the creditors of George S. Allnutt to file their claims, duly authenticated, in the office of the Clerk of this Court.

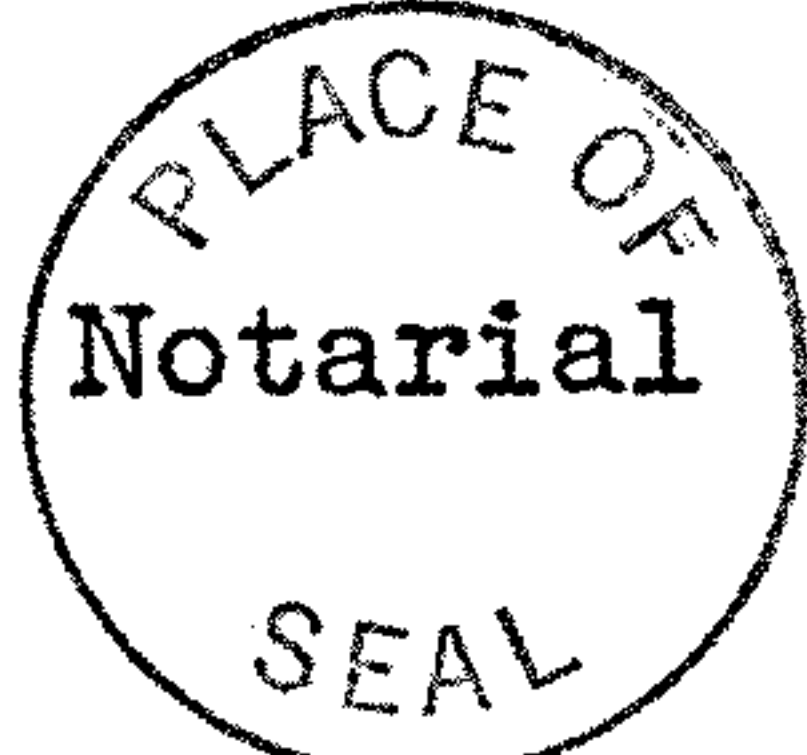
And for such further or other relief as the nature and equity of the case may require.
