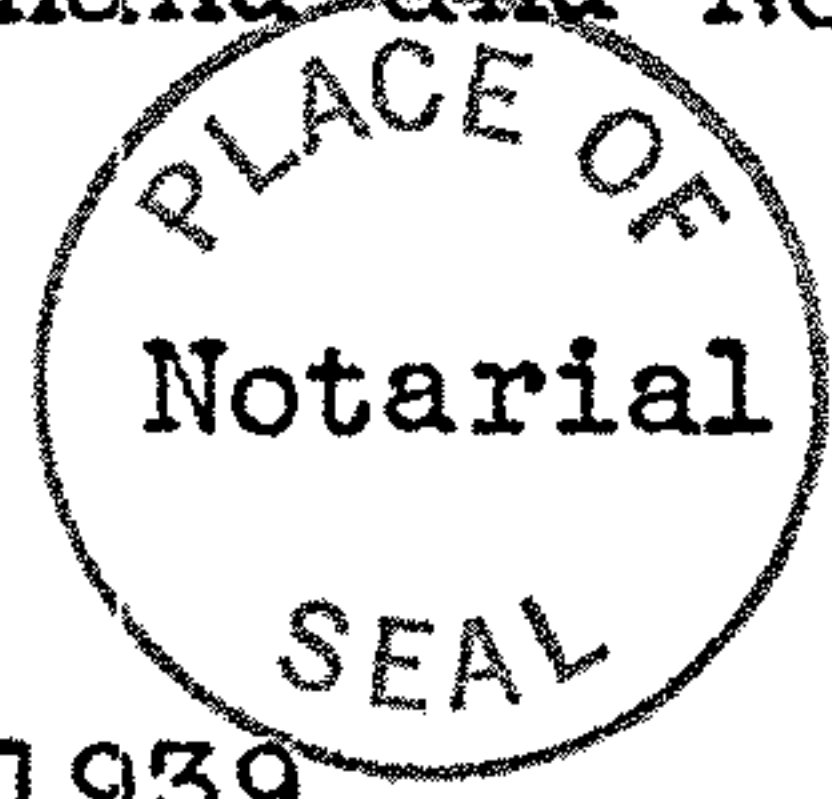

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

Pursuant to the decree Pro Confesso and the Order of your Honorable Court passed in the above-entitled cause, and at the request of the Plaintiff's Solicitor to take testimony therein, I, Alfred R. Jones, one of the Standing Examiners of your Honorable Court, duly appointed, qualified and sworn, at the office of Leslie N. Coblentz, Esquire, Frederick City, Maryland, on the 19th day of August, 1939, at the hour of 10:30 A. M., proceeded to take the following depositions of the witnesses then and there produced before me, that is to say,

Complainant and witnesses.

Arthur V. Myers, a witness of lawful age, being duly sworn, deposes and says as follows:

- Q. State your name and residence.
- A. I live in Frederick and my name is Arthur V. Myers.
- Q. What is your occupation?
- A. I am Vice President of the Frederick County National Bank of Frederick.
- Q. Does your bank hold any obligations of Hanson M. Thompson, and if so what is its nature.
- A. Our bank holds the judgment of which this is a copy (witness was shown Exhibit No. 1) against Hanson M. Thompson and Emma C. Thompson, his wife, upon which there is a balance due of \$350 and upon which interest is due from August 30th, 1937. We also hold another judgment of Mr. and Mrs. Thompson of which this is a copy (witness was shown Exhibit No. 2) and on this judgment the whole principal sum of \$1000 is due and interest is due from January 1st, 1938.
- Q. State whether you know if Mr. or Mrs. Thompson owned real estate during their life time.
- A. Mr and Mrs. Thompson owned two lots in Brunswick located in the vicinity of Ninth Street.
- Q. Did they own any other property to your knowledge?
- A. I am quite sure that they owned nothing else. I have always understood that they lived on a B. & O. pension up to their death. There has been no administration on their estates.
- Q. Do you know, or can you state, any other matter or thing which may be of benefit or advantage to the parties to this cause, or either of them, or that may be material to the subject of this your examination, or the matters in question between the parties?
- A. I have nothing further to add.
