

that it would be to the best interest and advantage of all the said parties in interest that the property be sold under a decree of your Honorable Court and that the money accruing from said sale be divided among the said parties in interest according to their respective rights.

TO THE END, THEREFORE,

1) That a decree may be passed for the sale of the real estate hereinbefore described under the direction of your Honorable Court, and that the proceeds thereof may be distributed among the parties entitled according to their respective interests.

2) And that your Complainants may have such other and further relief as the nature and equity of their case may require.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR HONORABLE COURT to grant unto your Complainants Writs of Subpoena directed to the said Betty Lee Carr, who is temporarily residing in Brunswick, Frederick County, Maryland, and to the Peoples National Bank in Brunswick, a body corporate, commanding the said Defendants to be and appear in this court at some certain date to be named therein, and to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree as may be passed herein.

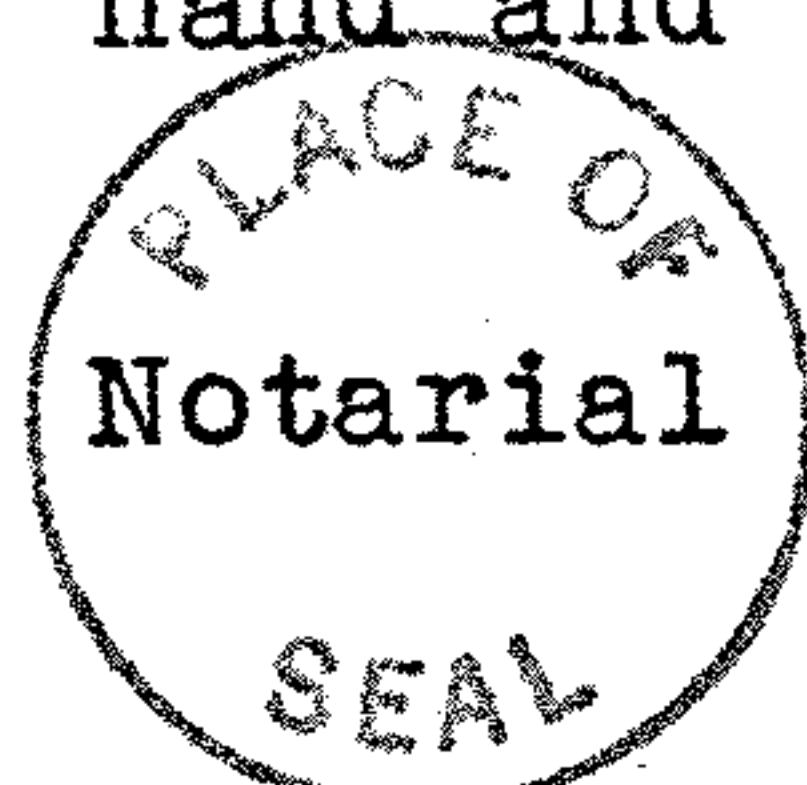

This Deed, made this 15th day of September in the year 1906, by us, William L. Gross, and Annie C. Gross, his wife, both of Frederick County, Maryland. Witnesseth: That for and in consideration of the sum of One Thousand Dollars, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, we, the said William L. Gross and Annie C. Gross, his wife, do grant and convey, alien and enfeoff, unto James H. Thompson, of Brunswick in said Frederick County, aforesaid, all that lot of land and improvements located in the said town of Brunswick, which was conveyed to the said William L. Gross, by deed from Joseph W. Noland and Virginia C. Noland, his wife, dated May 11, 1906 and recorded in Liber S.T.H. No. 276, folio 264, and so forth, one of the land records of Frederick County. It being lot number one in block number seventeen on a plat of part of Brunswick recorded in liber J.L.J.
