B. Philip Crumbacker, a son, whose wife's name is Pirsilla Crumbacker, who resides in Baltimore, Maryland.

C. Nevin Crumbacker, a son, whose wife's name is Doris Crumbacker, who resides in Baltimore, Maryland.

D. Cecelia Gerlach, a daughter, whose husband's name is Michael Gerlach, who resides in Catonsville, Maryland.

E. Florence Doyle, a daughter, whose husband's name is John Doyle, who resides in Baltimore, Maryland.

(2) That your Complainant, acting as Administrator of the goods and chattels of the said Martha Biehl discovers and alleges that the personal property of which the said decedent died seized and possessed is insufficient to pay her debts and obligations including funeral expenses.

(3) That the said Martha Biehl died seized and possessed of all that lot and parcel of ground situate, lying and being in New Market, in Frederick County, Maryland, which was conveyed unto Mattie L. Biehl by the Frederick County National Bank of Frederick, Maryland, by deed dated November 6, 1937, and recorded in Liber No. 409, Folio 506, one of the Land Records of Frederick County, a certified copy of which said deed is filed herewith as a part hereof and marked Exhibit "No. 1", said real estate being located on Main Street, in the Village of New Market, in Frederick County, Maryland, fronting thereon 66 feet and running back a distance of 330 feet.

TO THE END, THEREFORE:

1. That the aforesaid real estate of the said Martha Biehl may be sold for the payment of the debts of the said decedent aforementioned; and that the proceeds of sale may be distributed in payment thereof to creditors of the said Martha Biehl.

And for such other and further relief as the nature of the case may require.
