(2) That the Complainant, acting as Administrator of the goods and chattels of the said Martha Biehl discovers and alleges that the personal property of which the said decedent died seized and possessed is insufficient to pay her debts and obligations including funeral expenses.

(3) That the said Martha Biehl died seized and possessed of all that lot and parcel of ground situate, lying and being in New Market, in Frederick County, Maryland, which was conveyed unto Mattie L. Biehl by the Frederick County National Bank of Frederick, Maryland, by deed dated November 6, 1937, and recorded in Liber No. 409, folio 506, one of the Land Records of Frederick County, a certified copy of which said deed is filed herewith as a part hereof and marked Exhibit "No. 1", said real estate being located on Main Street, in the Village of New Market, in Frederick County, Maryland, fronting thereon 66 feet and running back a distance of 330 feet.

The Bill prays for the sale of the real estate of Martha Biehl, and that the proceeds of sale be used for the payment of her creditors.

It is thereupon, this 4th day of August, 1943, ordered by the Circuit Court for Frederick County in Equity that the Plaintiff, by causing a copy of this Order to be inserted in some newspaper in Frederick County once a week for four successive weeks before the 3rd day of September, 1943, give notice unto Elmer Crumbacker and Glenna Crumbacker, his wife; Norman H. Crumbacker; David R. Crumbacker and Annie Crumbacker, his wife; Cecelia Gluth and Edward A. Gluth, her husband; Orville Crumbacker and Lillian Crumbacker, his wife; Mary Shatzer and Charles Shatzer, her husband; and Mabel Frock and Harrison Frock, her husband, non-resident Defendants of the object and substance of this Bill, warning them to appear in this Court in person or by solicitor on or before the 20th day of September, 1943, to show cause, if any they have, why a decree should not be passed as prayed.
