

(3) That Annie W. Rothenhoefer, executrix of the estate of Charles F. Rothenhoefer, deceased, may be ordered to present her books and accounts unto your Honorable Court and account for all income and expenditures of the estate of Charles F. Rothenhoefer and that your Honorable Court will assume jurisdiction of the funds and other assets of the estate in possession of the said executrix.

(4) And for such other and further relief as the nature and equity of the case may require.

May It Please Your Honors to grant unto your Complainant the Writ of Subpoena directed unto the said Annie Rothenhoefer widow, and Annie Rothenhoefer, Executrix of the Last Will and Testament of Charles F. Rothenhoefer, Mary Jones and G. Arthur Jones, her husband, Pauline Koontz, widow, Edgar Rothenhoefer, unmarried, C. Roger Rothenhoefer, divorced, The Domestic Building Association of Frederick County, a body corporate, with office located at Frederick County, Maryland, Pauline Bowlus and Richard Bowlus, her husband, Louise Strine and Paul Strine, her her husband, Marianna Legore and Ralston Legore, her husband, Helen Jones, unmarried, Marie Jones, unmarried, Nancy Jones, unmarried, Betty Rogers and John Rogers, her husband, Roger Rothenhoefer and Betty Rothenhoefer, his wife; commanding them to be and appear in your Honorable Court at some certain day, to be named therein, and answer the premises and abide by and perform such Decree as may be passed therein; and that your Honors will also grant unto your Complainant an Order of Publication directed to the said Ruth E.
