The above cause standing ready for a hearing, and being submitted, the Bill, Answer, Exhibits testimony and all other proceedings were by the Court read and considered It is thereupon, this 24th day of March in the year nineteen hundred and forty two by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, as a Court of Equity, and by the authority of said Court, adjudged, ordered and decreed, that the land and premises mentioned in these proceedings be sold, and that Leslie N. Coblentz, Esq., of Frederick County, be, and he is hereby appointed Trustee to make the said sales, and that the course and manner of his proceedings shall be as follows: He shall first file in the Clerk's office of this Court, a Bond to the State of Maryland, executed by him with a surety, or sureties, to be approved by the Court, or the Clerk, thereof, in the penalty of one Thousand Dollars, if corporate surety is given and
