4. That all of the persons to this proceeding are adults.

5. That the real estate hereinbefore described is constantly depreciating in value because of the lack of supervision and proper maintenance and care of the improvements thereon, and that said real estate cannot be divided without loss or injury to the parties interested therein, and that it would be to the best interest and advantage of all the said parties in interest that the property be sold under a decree of your Honorable Court, and that the money accruing from said sale be divided among said parties in interest according to their respective rights.

TO THE END, THEREFORE:

(1) That a decree may be passed for the sale of the real estate hereinbefore described under the direction of your Honorable Court, and that the proceeds thereof may be distributed among the parties entitled according to their respective interests.

(2) And that your Complainants may have such other and further relief as the nature and equity of their case may require.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR HONORABLE COURT to grant unto your Complainants an Order of Publication against the said Elsie S. Vansant and the National Bank of Topeka ordering them to be and appear in this Court in person or by solicitor on or before a certain day to be named therein to show cause, if any they have, why a decree should not be passed as herein prayed.
