Q. I show you a deed filed in this proceeding as Exhibit "No.-6". Will you state whether or not this deed correctly describes the Carroll County real estate of which Mr. Clary died seized and possessed? (Exhibit "No.6" filed in evidence.)

A. Yes.

Q. Did Mr. Clary leave a Will?

A. Yes.

Q. I show you a paper filed in this proceeding as "Exhibit No. 7". Will you examine it, please, and state whether or not it is a true copy of the Will of Aaron Clary.

A. Yes, it is. (Exhibit "No.7" filed in evidence.)

Q. By the terms of the will, who was named his personal representative?

A. Clinton E. Vansant.

Q. Is Mr. Vansant living?

A. No.

Q. When did he die?

A. September 5, 1942

Q. Do you recall the provision of Mr. Clary's Will?

A. Yes.

Q. Will you state the principal provisions of the same?

A. One-half of the estate was devised to my mother, Sarah F. Vansant, and the other one-half was devised to Clinton E. Vansant in trust for my uncle, Charles A. Clary, for his life, and upon his death, provided he died without leaving issue, the remainder was devised to the children of my mother, Sarah F. Vansant, especially excepting, however, Stella Spurrier.

Q. Is Charles A. Clary now living?

A. No.

Q. When did he die?

A. July 18, 1924.

Q. Where did he die?

A. In the City of Frederick, Maryland.

Q. Did he leave any children lawfully begotten surviving him?

A. No.

Q. Is Sarah F. Vansant living?

A. No.

Q. When and where did she die?

A. She died February 21, 1923, in Topeka, Kansas.

Q. Did she die intestate?

A. Yes.

Q. Was she married at the time of her death?

A. No.

Q. Will you state the names of the children surviving?

A. A son, Clinton E. Vansant; a daughter, Nettie Vansant Disney; a daughter, Fannie Vansant Athey; a daughter, Mabel Vansant Spurrier; a son, Reese S. Vansant; a daughter, Lucy Vansant Coe; a daughter, Estella Vansant Spurrier; a daughter, Estella Vansant Spurrier; a daughter Anna Vansant Disney.

Q. Are all of the children surviving your mother living now?

A. No. Reese died at Topeka, Kansas, on or about December 8, 1935.

Q. Did he die testate or intestate?

A. Testate.

Q. I show you a copy of a will filed in this proceeding as Exhibit "No.8", Will you look at.
