

(b) The children and heirs at law of William T. Hallar, a deceased son of Charles W. Hallar (whose widow is deceased) as follows:

(1) Hester Hallar Best, a daughter, whose husband's name is John T. Best, both adults, residing in Frederick City, Maryland.

(2) Charles W. Hallar, a son, whose wife's name is Mayble Hallar, both adults, residing in Philadelphia, State of Pennsylvania.

(3) Elizabeth (Lizzie) Buch, a daughter, whose husband's name is Frank Buch, both adults, residing in Frederick City, Maryland.

(4) Frank Hallar, a son, whose wife's name is Mildred Hallar, both adults, residing in Zanesville, Ohio.

(5) Wilson B. Hallar, a son, whose wife's name is Catherine Hallar, both adults, residing in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and Wheeling, West Virginia.

(6) Preston Hallar, a son, whose wife's name is Inez Hallar, both adults, residing in Baltimore City, Maryland.

(7) Louise Hallar Roderick, a daughter, whose husband's name is Samuel Roderick, both adults, residing in Frederick City, Maryland.

(c) That the said Charles W. Hallar left another daughter (not named in the deed Exhibit No. 1) whose name is Hettie Tyson, whose husband is deceased and who is an adult and resides at Chevy Chase, Maryland, who is entitled to a one-fourth interest in said real estate.

(d) That the said Charles W. Hallar left another daughter (not named in the deed Exhibit No. 1) whose name is Alice Hallar Anders, whose husband's name was _____ Anders, both of whom are dead and left a son, Charles Anders, who is also deceased, but left a widow surviving him named Mame Anders, an adult, residing in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and two children, namely:

(1) Fred Anders, a son, whose wife's name is _____ Anders, both adults, residing in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

(2) Mame Anders, a daughter, whose husband's (if any) name is _____, both of whom are adults (if living), whose residence is unknown, but when last heard from, resided in Washington, in the District of Columbia.

And the Bill prays for the following relief:

(a) That a decree may be passed for a sale of said real estate.

(b) That the proceeds of sale may be divided between the parties to this cause according to their respective rights and interest therein.

(c) And for general relief and for process and Order of Publication against the non-resident defendants.

It is thereupon, this 15th day of June, 1942, by the Circuit Court for Frederick County Maryland, sitting as a Court of Equity, and by the authority thereof,

Ordered, that the Plaintiffs give notice to the said non-resident defendants to this cause of the object and substance of this Bill, by causing a copy of such to be published in some newspaper published in Frederick County, Maryland, once a week for four successive weeks prior to the 14th day of July, 1942, commanding them to be and appear in person or by Solicitor, in said Court, on or before the 30th day of July, 1942, to show cause, if any they may have, why a decree should not be passed as prayed.
