At the request of Barton V. B. Garrott the following Deed is recorded April 25, 1878.

This Deed made this 20th day of April, in the year 1878 by Barton Garrott and Mary P. Garrott his wife, of Frederick County, in the State of Maryland, Witnesseth, that for the consideration of Four thousand five hundred dollars, the said Barton Garrott and Mary P. Garrott ~~and his wife~~, his wife, do grant in fee simple unto Barton V. B. Garrott, of the same county and state all that part of a tract of land, lying and being in the aforesaid county and State, contained in the following metes and bounds, being part of a tract of land called "Merreland," Beginning for the same at the end of the fourth line of lot No. 22 also a part of said tract deeded by a certain John Philpott Garrott ^{to John Garrott} and running thence North fifty four degrees West forty six perches, North sixty seven and a half degrees West twenty three perches North fifty nine degrees West twelve perches to intersect the tenth line of the "Resurvey on Merreland" then South sixty two and a quarter degrees West seventy six and a half perches to a stone, then South twenty five and a half degrees East one hundred perches South seven degrees East one hundred and twenty perches to intersect the divisional line between Nos. 22 and 14 as laid down by Charles Beatty, then with said divisional line to the end of the fourth line of the said lot of land sold by John Philpott Garrott to John Garrott containing one hundred acres of land.
