

(2) That the County Treasurer of Frederick County, Maryland, may be directed to prepare and execute a deed conveying the fee simple title to V. Augustus and Mary A. Stevens, his wife, the Complainants herein, upon payment of the purchase price in full, together with all taxes, interest and penalties thereon accruing subsequent to the date of sale.

(3) And for such other and further relief as the nature of their case may require.

May it please your Honors to grant unto your Complainants the Order of Publication giving notice to the unknown owner or owners of the property located in Mt. Pleasant District, Frederick County, Maryland, and described as twenty acres of land, and assessed to Annie Costley, and all persons known and unknown having or claiming to have an interest in and to the real estate herein described, warning them to be and appear in this Court in person or by Solicitor, on or before a certain day to be named therein, to answer said bill of complaint or to redeem said property, and in case of failure to do so, a final decree will be rendered foreclosing all rights of redemption in said property.

And also the Writ of Subpoena directed to James H. Walk, County Treasurer of Frederick County, Maryland, Nathan Ogle and Joseph Ogle, adult residents of Frederick City, Frederick County, Maryland, commanding them and each of them, to be and appear, either in person or by Solicitor in this Court on or before a certain day to be named therein, to answer said bill of complaint or to redeem said property, and in case of failure to do so, a final decree will be rendered foreclosing all rights of redemption in said property.
