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To the Honorable the Judges of said Court:

The Petition of V. Augustus Stevens and Mary A. Stevens, his wife, Assignees of Certificate of Sale, respectfully shows:

- 1- That your Petitioners filed a Bill in this Honorable Court to foreclose the rights of redemption in the property located in Mount Pleasant District, described as 20 acres and assessed to Annie Costley, on February 15, 1946.
- 2- That Joseph Ogle, by Edward D. Storm, Esq., his solicitor, filed an Answer on April 30, 1946, wherein he states he desires to redeem said property.
