PETITION FOR FORECLOSURE OF RIGHTS OF REDEMPTION, AND ORDER OF COURT

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To the Honorable the Judges of said Court:

The Petition of V. Augustus Stevens and Mary A. Stevens, his wife, Assignees of Certificate of Sale, respectfully shows:

- 1- That on the 15th day of February, in the year 1946, they filed their Bill of Complaint against Nathan Ogle, Joseph Ogle, Devisees, and all persons having or claiming to have any interest in and to the property located in Mount Pleasant District, in Frederick County, Maryland, described as 20 acres of land, more or less, and assessed to Annie Costley and sold at tax sale by the Collector of Taxes for Frederick County, Maryland, on the 10th day of April 1944, to W. Paul Etzler and Norma W. Etzler, his wife, who on the 13th day of April, 1945, for value received, assigned and transferred said Certificate of Sale unto your Petitioners.
- 2- That at the time provided by law for Annie Costley and Nathan Ogle, and all persons having or claiming to have any interest therein through them to redeem said property has expired and the said Annie Costley and Nathan Ogle, two of the Defendants, have failed to answer said Bill of Complaint or to redeem said lot, as provided by law.
- 3- That your Petitioners filed a Petition requiring the said Joseph Ogle to show cause, on or before December 20, 1946, why his Answer should not be dismissed for failure to proceed to redeem said property according to law.
- 4- That the said Joseph Ogle has failed to show cause and his Answer was by this Honorable Court dismissed on December 20, 1946.
