

Q. State your full name, residence and age.

A. William E. Corun; Jefferson, Maryland; sixty-seven.

Q. What is your occupation, Mr. Corun?

A. Retired.

Q. Did you know John W. Corun during his lifetime?

A. Yes, I knew him for about 40 years. He was my first cousin.

Q. State about when he died.

A. He died in 1938.

Q. Mr. Corun, whom did he leave as heirs?

A. Ruth Koogle, Anna Rice, Catherine King, Hazel Corun, Hobart Corun, Lewis Fulmer Corun, Calvin Corun, Marguerite Murray and Eleanor Wilhelm.

Q. Is Mr. John W. Corun's wife dead?

A. Yes.

Q. Did she die before or after Mr. Corun?

A. After Mr. John Corun.

Q. Do you know whether or not any of John Corun's children are dead?

A. No, sir, no children are dead.

Q. Are you acquainted with the real estate that Mr. Corun owned during his lifetime?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Where is it located?

A. It is located along the road leading across the mountain from the Jefferson Pike over Middletown Valley, near the railroad.

Q. Is it improved?

A. There aren't many improvements on the property. The house is in very bad shape and the barn has fallen down.

Q. What do you think it is worth?

A. I would say in about \$800.00.

Q. Do you know from whom he bought the larger parcel of this land?

A. From Elias Zimmerman.

Q. I will show you a deed from Elias Zimmerman and Annie Zimmerman, his wife, to John W. Corun, dated April 16, 1892, and recorded in Liber J.L.J. No. 1, Folio 438, one of the Land Records of Frederick County. Will you look at it and see if it described the property. (Deed #2 identified)

A. Yes, sir, that is the property.

Q. Was there another property added to this main parcel?

A. Yes, sir, the lot he purchased from Mr. Remsburg.

Q. I will show you a deed from Emory R. Remsburg and Nannie M. Remsburg, his wife, to John W. Corun, dated April 30, 1896, and recorded in Liber No. 423, Folio 166, one of the Land Records of Frederick County. Will you identify that? (Deed #4 identified)

A. Yes, sir, that is the deed.

Q. Did Mr. John Corun own any other land, to your knowledge, at the time of his death?

A. No, I don't think so, except a parcel from Mr. Long.

Q. Let me show you a deed dated February 16, 1894, from John D. Long and Mary C. Long, his wife, to John W. Corun, recorded in Liber J.L.J. No. 16, one of the Land Records of Frederick County, and tell us if this is the property he bought. (Deed #3 identified)

A. Yes, sir, that is the property he purchased from Long.

Q. Do you know where that property is located, Mr. Corun?

A. It adjoins, at the present time, Mr. Bank and also Mr. Young, but it does not adjoin Mr. Corun's other property.
