

known heirs of the said Thomas L. Danner, deceased, as provided by Section 139 of Article 16 of the Annotated Code of the Public General Laws of Maryland.

5. That the said real estate is continuously depreciating in value and cannot be divided without loss or injury to the parties interested therein, and that it would be to the best interest and advantage to all of the parties in interest that the property be sold under a decree of your Honorable Court and the money accruing from said sale to be divided among the said parties according to their respective interests.

The bill then prays that a decree may be passed for the sale of the real estate of the said Thomas L. Danner, deceased, and that the proceeds thereof may be distributed among the parties entitled according to their respective interests, and for general relief.

It is thereupon, this 15th day of August, 1940, by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting in Equity, and by the authority thereof, ordered that the Plaintiffs herein give notice to the non-resident heirs of Thomas L. Danner, deceased, and to the heirs of said decedent whose present addresses are unknown, and all other unknown heirs of the said decedent, of the object and substance of this Bill of Complaint by causing a copy of such to be inserted in some newspaper published in Frederick County, Maryland, once a week for four successive weeks prior to the 21st day of September, 1940, commanding the aforesaid Defendants to be and appear in this Court, in person or by solicitor, on or before the 7th day of October, 1940, to show cause, if any they have, why a decree should not be passed as prayed.
