PETITION OF SUBSTITUTED TRUSTEE

To the Honorable the Judges of said Court:

The Petition of Holden S. Felton, substituted Trustee, in the above-entitled cause, respectfully shows unto your Honors:

1- That your Petitioner was on the 12th day of March, 1931, by an order of this Honorable Court appointed as substituted Trustee in the above cause, for and in the place and stead of George A. Pearre, Jr., Esq., who resigned as Trustee herein.

2- That your Petitioner duly qualified as said substituted Trustee by filing a surety company bond in the penalty of \$6,000.00, as provided by said order, and said Petitioner has ever since been acting as said Trustee.

3- That at the time your Petitioner assumed said trusteeship said trust estate was composed of the following assets, to-wit:

(a) All that house and lot situated on the West side of North Market Street, in Frederick, Maryland, known and designated as Nos. 217 and 219 on said North Market Street.

(b) All that house and lot situated on the West side of said North Market Street, known and designated as Nos. 225 and 227 on said Street.

(c) All that double brick dwelling house situated on the North side of East Third Street, in Frederick, Maryland, and being known and designated as houses No. 11 and No. 13 on said Street.

(d) Four \$1,000.00 Arundel Mortgage Company 6% First Mortgage Certificates.

(e) The sum of \$59.60 in cash, being money deposited in the Fredericktown Savings Institution, subject to check.

4- That the aforesaid named assets constituted the entire estate which was turned over to your Petitioner.

5- That the aforesaid Arundel Mortgage Company 6% First Mortgage Certificate matured, and by an order of this Honorable Court two new \$1,000.00 Arundel Mortgage Certificate 6% bonds were purchased by your Petitioner, and two thousand dollars was deposited at interest in the Fredericktown Savings Institution.

6- That due to market conditions and financial conditions the Arundel Mortgage Company had to effect a plan of reorganization, and by an order of this Honorable Court passed on the 21st day of November, 1933, said Petitioner was authorized to exchange said two \$1,000.00 bonds, being No. M-1293 and No. M-1294, in the face amount of \$1,000.00 each, for two new \$1,000.00 twenty year bonds in said Arundel Mortgage Company, upon the terms set forth in the
