Holden S. Felton, substituted Trustee under the Will of Elizabeth Bues- ing Miller, late of Fred- erick County, Maryland,	"	No. 11,555 Equity

The petition of Holden S. Felton, Trustee in this proceeding, and the petition and answer of Frederick A. Miller, Jr., and the testimony taken before the Court at the hearing on said petitions and answer having been considered, and it appearing that Minnie E. Miller, the beneficiary for life of a portion of the trust estate administered in this proceeding had died intestate, and that there is an intestacy on the part of Elizabeth Buesing Miller, the creator of said trust, in regard to the portion of said trust estate from which, as directed by her will, the income was payable to the said Minnie E. Miller, during her life, no provision having been made by said will for the disposition of said portion of the trust estate after the death of the said beneficiary for life without having exercised the power of appointment conferred upon her by said will, and said portion of the trust estate being therefore now vested in the said Frederick A. Miller, Jr., as the only heir at law of the said Elizabeth Buesing Miller, deceased, subject to such sale of a part of said trust estate as may be necessary to discharge the unpaid indebtedness incurred by the trust during the existence of said life estate, and subject also to the allocation of a portion of the trust estate, to the value of \$10,000 thereof, to serve the continuing purposes of the trust, insofar as it was created by said will for the benefit of the said Frederick A. Miller, Jr., for his life, with limitations in remainder as prescribed by said will, and it appearing that the trust property, known as Nos, 225 and 227, on the West side of North Market Street, in Frederick City, Maryland, should be sold for the purposes aforesaid, and that the trust property known as Nos. 217 and 219 on the West side of North Market Street in said City should be allocated to the said continuing trust under the will of the said Elizabeth Buesing Miller, deceased, and the said Frederick A. Miller, Jr., having consented by his petition and answer, and in his testimony, to said sale and allocation,
