To the Honorable, the Judges of said Court:

The Petition of C. A. Lawrence Downey and Edward J. Smith, Trustees in the above cause respectfully shows unto your Honors:

1st. That pursuant to an order of your Honorable Court, passed in the above cause July 26th. 1935, authorizing your petitioners to accept an offer of compromise made by George W. Horman in payment and satisfaction of the indebtedness due by him to Anna D. Shank, individually, and to your petitioners as trustees in the above cause, which agreement of compromise was ratified by the United States District Court for the District of Maryland, in the case entered on the Docket of said Court as No. 8273, In the Matter of George W. Horman Debtor, In proceedings for a Composition or Extension Under Section 75 of the Bankrupt Act, the said George W. Horman and wife conveyed to the said Anna D. Shank, individually and to your petitioners as trustees in the above cause a farm situated in Urbana District, in Frederick County, Maryland, containing 181 acres of land, more or less, which is fully described in the petition filed in the above cause July 26th. 1935. That the said George W. Horman also executed and delivered to the said Anna D. Shank, individually and to your petitioners as trustees in the above cause an assignment in the sum of \$1,000.00, of a trust fund created by William H. Horman, the father of George W. Horman, for the benefit of his wife for life, in which the said George W. Horman has an equitable interest in remainder of approximately \$1,900.00, upon the death of his mother, said sum of \$1,000. bearing interest at the rate of 4% per annum until paid.

2nd. That since said farm was conveyed to the said Anna D. Shank, individually and to your petitioners they have tired to dispose of the same at private sale to the best advantage of the owners. That the best offer the owners of said farm have received for the same is the sum of \$3,500.00. That Mrs. Moselle Bayard Rosencrantz, as General Guardian for Paul Bulin, Jr., Bayard Burlin, Mary Moselle, Patricia Faith, Ivor Burlin and Rudolph Burlin
