THIS DEED, made this 14th day of March in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-four by and between us, Mary E. Diffendal and William Diffendal, her husband, of the City of Danville in the State of Virginia, Alice G. Smith and James W. Smith, her husband, of Frederick County, Maryland, Susan J. Eichelberger and Joseph L. Eichelberger, her husband, of the City of Washington in the District of Columbia, J. M. Wright Barrick and J. Elizabeth Barrick, his wife, of Carroll County, Maryland, William M. Barrick and Rebecca H. Barrick, his wife, of the City of Danville aforesaid (the said Rebecca H. Barrick being now temporarily in said Frederick County) Fannie C. Barrick, Ida J. C. Barrick and Robert E. L. Barrick of Frederick County aforesaid, of the first part, and Charles J. Barrick of Frederick County aforesaid of the second part,

WITNESSETH, that by the provisions of the last Will and Testament of a certain Jacob Crise, late of Frederick County aforesaid, deceased, dated August 18th. A.D. 1851, now of record in Will Record T. S. No. 1, Folio 209 &c., one of the record books of Wills in the office of the Register of Wills of Frederick County aforesaid, the real estate hereinafter mentioned and described was devised by the said Jacob Crise to his daughter, Susan Barrick, the wife of a certain George W. Barrick, for and during her natural life and at her death then to her children, those now surviving her, the said Susan Barrick, being the above named Mary E. Diffendal, Alice G. Smith, Susan J.
