

This farm is on the Rocky Ridge and Woodsboro Road, and is described in the certified copy of the deed, marked "Exhibit A", filed in these proceedings. The land lies in one tract and is used principally as a dairy farm, The farm is now being operated by my brother, Harry W. Barrick, who has been operating it ever since the death of my father.

5. When did your father die?

A. He died on February the 12th, 1928.

6. What heirs at law did your father leave at the time of his death?

A. He left no surviving widow, but four sons, namely: George Dix Barrick, Harry W. Barrick, Grover E. Barrick, and Maurice V. Barrick, as his only heirs at law.

7. Have any of the above named sons departed this life?

A. Yes. George D. Barrick, died in December 1933, intestate, and left surviving him, as his only heirs at law, the following: His widow, Emma J. Barrick, who resides at No. 513 E. Cold Spring Lane, George Dix Barrick, Jr., unmarried, Mary Ruth Barrick, unmarried, Emma Jane Diefenbach, whose husband's name is Gordon Diefenbach, Robert N. Barrick, whose wife's name is Katherine S. Barrick, and Nancy Louise Barrick, unmarried, all residents of Baltimore City, Maryland.

Maurice V. Barrick, died in September, 1942, and left surviving him as his only heirs at law, his widow, E. Ruth Barrick, and one daughter, Marian Adelle Barrick, both of whom are residing in Hagerstown, Maryland, at No. 40 Cannon Avenue. The said Maurice Barrick, also died intestate.

Harry Barrick resides at Rocky Ride, and his wife's name is Carrie Barrick.

Grover E. Barrick, the affiant, resides at Cavetown, Maryland, and his wife's name is Emma L. Barrick.

8. What in your opinion is a fair market price for this farm?

A. I believe that \$50.00 per acre would be a fair price.

9. Can this real estate be divided amongst the parties interested, without loss and damage?

A. No. The land is used as one farm, has one set of buildings and could not be divided. Cross -Examination waived by Patrick M. Schnauffer, solicitor for Harry W. Barrick and Carrie Barrick, his wife, defendants.

To the general interrogatory?

A. I think that is all.

Grover E. Barrick

E. Ruth Barrick, one of the defendants, being duly sworn deposes and says as follows:

1. Please state your name, age and residence.

A. My name is E. Ruth Barrick, I reside at No. 40 Cannon Avenue, in Hagerstown, Maryland, I am 46 years of age.

2. Did you know the late Charles J. Barrick, of Rocky Ridge, in Frederick County, Maryland?

A. Yes. He was my father-in-law.

3. Do you know the other parties to this suit?

A. Yes. I know all of them.

4. Is Charles J. Barrick living or dead?

A. He is dead. He died on or about February 12, 1928.

5. Did he leave a widow surviving him?

A. No, Mrs. Barrick died before Charles J. Barrick died.

6. Whom did he leave as his heirs at law?

A. Four sons, George Dix Barrick, Harry W. Barrick, Grover E. Barrick, and Morris V. Barrick.
